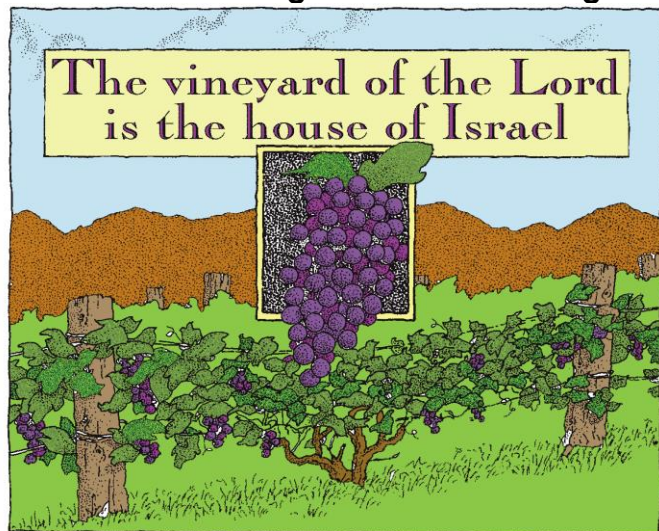

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BEARING THE RIGHT KIND OF FRUIT

Today's readings focus our attention on vineyards. Isaiah's song concerning his friend's vineyard begins with inspiring and poetic images of an idyllic vineyard where the choicest harvest is expected. Instead, the vineyard yields wild grapes, which causes the owner to abandon it. The psalmist cries out to God, asking that God once again take care of the vineyard, which is the house of Israel. The parable told in today's Gospel offers a stern warning that those who commit treachery in the hopes of attaining personal wealth will be "put . . . to a wretched death" (Matthew 21:41). Jesus warns his listeners not to act like the murderous tenants in the vineyard. Instead he exhorts them to produce the kind of fruit that will lead them to the kingdom of God.

The Pastor's Corner

Let me now sing of my friend,
my friend's song concerning his vineyard.

Isaiah would seem to have something beautiful to share, if he's not just wanting to tell us but wants to sing about it. Of course, when we hear the actual verses, we discover they're sung in minor key, a sad song. The vineyard was meant to be something beautiful: care, tenderness and effort went into it, but instead this song is about heartache.

And of course Jesus' variation in the Gospel is even worse. This time human lives are involved, and the culminating moment arrives when the vineyard keeper sends his son to the tenants, thinking, "They will respect my son."

And we know this version of the story is tragic: we the tenants think we can get something out of him dying, so we seize him, and throw him out of the vineyard dead.

We can wonder if the vineyard keeper ever after regretted sending his son: realizing he had completely misunderstood what he was sending him into. The supernatural reality Jesus' story represents, an omniscient God sending his all-powerful Son into the world, is undertaken with full knowledge and full acceptance of the suffering necessary, but the version heard in the parable can leave us grieving with the father who has lost what he most treasured, a beloved child.

I wonder also about the tenants in the story: did they also have a moment of dawning realization, and also feel clawing regret? When what we've done sinks in, when we realize that the harm we've caused we can't take back, is there a new wound in our heart that can't heal?

In Jesus' parable the story ends with abrupt justice, but again in reality there is a different nuance. Sin is its own punishment: the dawning realization of what we've done brings the experience the greatest horror, the greatest anguish. Our hearts become vaults where the nightmare repeats over and over, but we ourselves are the monster. There's a theological understanding of Hell, the place of greatest torment, as being a mercy offered by God for those who have realized what they've done, and can't escape the regret of the harm they've caused. In that understanding the pain of Hell is a relief from the much worse remorse of our unveiled sin.

Isaiah and Jesus' stories with their tragic endings are not how our story has to end. As a people who have listened to the whole Bible, we have also heard the astonishing story of forgiveness, the incomprehensible insistent message from God that he can undo the harm we've done, wipe away our sins. God can change our identities so we are no longer the agents of harm but the bearers of blessing. This is what makes it so beautiful to be a Christian, to get to be one of the people that can let others know they can be all right, that every wound can be healed. Sin is universal: every person you meet is hurting and hurts others. We can help make forgiveness universal as well.



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DAR BUEN FRUTO

Las lecturas de hoy ponen su atención en las viñas. El cántico de Isaías respecto a la viña de su amada comienza con inspiradoras y poéticas imágenes de una idílica viña de la cual se espera la más exquisita cosecha. En cambio, la viña da uvas agrias, lo cual hace que el dueño la abandone. El salmista clama a Dios, pidiéndole que la visite otra vez, ya que es la casa de Israel. La parábola que cuenta hoy el Evangelio ofrece la seria advertencia de que a los que cometen traición esperando obtener ganancia personal se les "dará muerte terrible" (Mateo 21:41). Jesús advierte a sus oyentes que no actúen como los viñadores asesinos en la viña. Más bien los exhorta a que produzcan el tipo de fruto que los llevará al Reino de Dios.

El Rincón del Párroco

Voy a cantar, en nombre de mi amado, / una canción a su viña.

Parecería que Isaías tiene algo hermoso que compartirnos, ya que no sólo quiere decirnos, si no que quiere cantar sobre ello. Por supuesto, cuando escuchamos los versos reales, descubrimos que son cantados en clave menor, una canción triste. La viña estaba destinada a ser algo hermoso ya que se le puso esfuerzo, cuidado, y ternura. Pero en lugar de eso resultó una canción de angustia.

Y, por supuesto, la variación de Jesús en el Evangelio de hoy es aún peor. Esta vez hay vidas humanas involucradas, y el momento culminante llega cuando el dueño del viñedo envía a su hijo a los viñadores, pensando: "Ellos respetarán a mi hijo".

Y sabemos que esta versión de la historia es trágica: ya que los viñadores pensaron que al matarlo se quedarían con la herencia. Al verlo los viñadores le echaron mano lo sacaron del viñero y lo mataron.

¿El encargado del viñedo se arrepentiría de haber enviado a su hijo?: ¿sabría lo que estaba enviando? La historia representa la historia de Jesús, un Dios omnisciente enviando a su Hijo todopoderoso al mundo, lo hace con pleno conocimiento y plena aceptación del sufrimiento necesario. La versión en la parábola puede dejarnos en duelo con el padre que ha perdido lo que más valoraba, su hijo amado.

Me pregunto también acerca de los inquilinos en la historia: ¿tendrían un momento de realización? ¿al amanecer, se arrepentirían de lo que habían hecho? Cuando nos damos cuenta del daño que hemos causado, no hay nada que podemos hacer para deshacer el daño causado, ¿hay una nueva herida en nuestro corazón que no puede sanar?

En la parábola de Jesús la historia termina con la justicia abrupta, pero de nuevo en la realidad hay un matiz diferente. El pecado es castigo: la comprensión de lo que hemos hecho hace que la experiencia sea el mayor horror, la mayor angustia. Nuestros corazones se convierten en bóvedas donde la pesadilla se repite una y otra vez, pero nosotros mismos somos el monstruo. Hay una comprensión teológica del infierno, el lugar del mayor tormento, como una misericordia ofrecida por Dios para aquellos que se han dado cuenta de lo que han hecho, y no pueden escapar del remordimiento del daño que han causado. Si entendemos eso, el dolor del Infierno es un alivio del remordimiento de nuestros pecados.

Isaías y las historias de Jesús con sus trágicas conclusiones no son cómo nuestra historia tiene que terminar. Como un pueblo que ha escuchado toda la Biblia, también hemos escuchado la asombrosa historia del perdón, el incomprensible mensaje de que Dios puede deshacer el daño que hemos hecho, borrar nuestros pecados. Dios puede cambiar nuestras identidades por lo que ya no somos los agentes de daño, sino los portadores de la bendición. Esto es lo que hace que sea tan hermoso ser un cristiano, llegar a ser una de las personas que pueden hacerles saber a otros que pueden estar bien, que cada herida puede ser curada. El pecado es universal: cada persona que conocemos está lastimada y lastimando a los demás. También podemos ayudar a que el perdón sea universal.

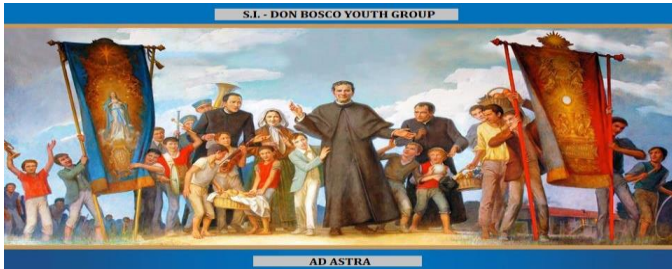

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults): Q & A
Q. What are the stages a person goes through to become Catholic?

A. The first stage is called the Pre-Catechumenate, or Inquiry. In this stage, those who are inquiring about the Catholic faith are welcomed and receive answers to their questions about God and His Church. As they begin to establish or to deepen their relationship with Christ, a foundation is placed in this process from which to build upon.

If and when a person is ready to move forward on the path to becoming a disciple of Christ, they are invited to go through the RCIA Rite of Acceptance and Welcoming. This is the rite that moves them into the next stage, called the Catechumenate, where the foundation they were given in the Pre-Catechumenate will be built upon and their relationship with Christ will be strengthened and deepened.

The third stage is called the Period of Purification and Enlightenment, which coincides with Lent. Before Lent begins, prospective disciples will discern if they are ready to move forward and if so, they will participate in the Rite of Sending at the parish and attend the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion with the Bishop at the Cathedral. There are many liturgical rites during this stage that are designed to give grace and spiritual strength to the participants as they near the reception of their sacraments at the Easter Vigil.
