

The Pastor's Corner

Our launch into Ordinary Time today opens with Saint Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians. Over the next few weeks, until we arrive at Ash Wednesday on Valentine's Day, we will continue through these chapters in First Corinthians that have the potential to introduce freedom into our lives.


As with Saint Paul's other letters, his secret to transformation is permitting the Holy Spirit to act in our lives. Today he tells us the Holy Spirit has a temple here on earth--our own bodies. A temple--most of us can conjure up an image of a temple pretty easily: perhaps something out of Indiana Jones, or the Parthenon in Athens. And depending on which storyline we draw our image from, we know a temple is not only a sacred place, but also a dangerous place--the deity within can strike down intruders.

The Temple of God in Jerusalem certainly bore that reputation. Into the Holy of Holies, the most sacred part of the Temple, the High Priest would venture only once a year, with a rope tied to his ankle, in case he died within. No one else would be able to enter the inner sanctum, so the rope would allow his body to be dragged back out were he suddenly to die.

This recognition of the power of the holy, and the temple as the place of the holy, shows us how to approach our own selves in our physical bodies. Saint Paul tells us that immorality desecrates this temple. Sexual immorality isn't just something that smudges or mars us--it's lethal. And this insight from Saint Paul is confirmed in the Church's teaching on the 10 Commandments, which affirms that sins of sexual immorality are mortal: banishing the Holy Spirit from our lives, and banishing us from heaven, until we return to the blood of Jesus.

And it's this blood that Saint Paul refers to today when he says our bodies have been purchased at a price. When Christ suffers on the cross, when his blood is poured out, it's to allow our bodies to become temples of the Holy Spirit, homes of God. It is for us today, even in a culture upside down in the respect for the body and respect for other's dignity, to return to this gift of the Holy Spirit and allow God's grace to transform us.

El Rincón del Párroco

Comenzamos el Tiempo Ordinario con la Primera Carta de San Pablo a los Corintios. Durante las próximas semanas, hasta el Miércoles de Ceniza lo cual cae el Día de San Valentín, estaremos repasando las cartas de los Corintios las cuales tienen el potencial de introducir la libertad en nuestras vidas.

Al igual que con las otras cartas de San Pablo, su secreto para la transformación es permitir que el Espíritu Santo actúe en nuestras vidas. Hoy nos dice que el Espíritu Santo tiene un templo aquí en la tierra: nuestros propios cuerpos. Un templo: la mayoría de nosotros puede conjurar una imagen de un templo con bastante facilidad: Quizás de las películas de Indiana Jones o el templo de Parthenon en Grecia. Sea cual sea la película o historia de donde saquemos nuestra imagen, sabemos que un templo no solo es un lugar sagrado, sino también un lugar peligroso ya que la divinidad interna puede derribar a los intrusos.

El Templo de Dios en Jerusalén tenía esa reputación. En el Lugar más Santo, la parte más sagrada del Templo, el Sumo Sacerdote solo salía una vez al año, y lo hacía con una cuerda atada a su tobillo, en caso de que muriera repentinamente, su cuerpo podría ser arrastrado hacia adentro, ya que a nadie más le era permitido entrar al santuario.

Este reconocimiento del poder que tiene lo Santo, y el templo como el lugar más Santo, nos enseña el enfoque que debemos tener hacia nuestros cuerpos. San Pablo nos dice que la inmoralidad profana este templo. La inmoralidad sexual no es solo algo que nos mancha o si no que es letal. Y esta visión de San Pablo se confirma en las enseñanzas de la Iglesia sobre los 10 mandamientos, que afirman que los pecados de inmoralidad sexual son mortales: Nos alejamos del Espíritu Santo y del cielo, la unión regresa el día que regresemos y formemos parte a la sangre de Cristo.

Y es esta sangre a lo que San Pablo se refiere hoy cuando dice que nuestros cuerpos han sido comprados a un precio. Cuando Cristo sufre en la cruz, cuando se derrama su sangre, es para permitir que nuestros cuerpos se conviertan en templos del Espíritu Santo, hogares de Dios. Es para nosotros hoy, incluso en una cultura invertida en el respeto por el cuerpo y el respeto por la dignidad de los demás, regresar a este don del Espíritu Santo y permitir que la gracia de Dios nos transforme.


Catechesis of the Good Shepherd




Catequesis el Buen Pastor



“Ordinary Time” began for us this week. On the old calendar, the feast of the Presentation, still more than two weeks away, was the last day of the Christmas season. Sadly, Bethlehem is hardly a place of peace on earth these days. The ancient Christian community has been largely uprooted by political strife. The Church of the Nativity stands (barely) in remarkable disrepair and disorder in Manger Square. The roof is crumbling, the major doorways are blocked, the wiring is faulty, and the worship life is disrupted by quarrels among Eastern Christians.

The church was founded by the Emperor Constantine in 325, destroyed in a Samaritan revolt in 539, and rebuilt by the Emperor Justinian. When the area came under Muslim control in 638, the holiness of the church was respected, and in return Christians allowed Muslims to pray in the south aisle, a right still upheld. Earlier in that century, invading Persians were ordered to destroy all churches, but when they saw the magi carved over the doorway of the Church of the Nativity, they spared it out of respect for their ancestors who bore gold, frankincense, and myrrh to the same city. The Crusaders restored and redecored the church by the twelfth century, and it is their plan that survives. Down a few stone steps is a stone grotto with a silver star marking the place of Christ’s birth: when the star was stolen in 1847 it triggered an international crisis that exploded into the Crimean War.

Since 1852, the church has been shared by the Roman Catholic, Greek Orthodox, and Armenian Churches. The Greeks are in charge of the grotto, but don’t enjoy the best of friendships with the Armenians. Catholics have the care of the Chapel of the Manger, and avoid the squabbles by a separate entrance to the Franciscan monastery church of St. Catherine. Pray for peace in Bethlehem!
