TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

"Octave" comes from the Latin word for "eight," and since eight is one step beyond seven, the number of days in a week, it has long been seen as a symbol of perfection, completion, and new beginnings. Early Christians called Sunday the "eighth day," since it was the day after the Sabbath and a day of resurrected life, the Lord's Day. By the seventh century, people regarded the eight days after Easter Sunday as one great day, an octave, one glorious feast when people were forbidden to fast or kneel. In the seventh century, Pentecost acquired an Octave, too. Christmas didn't claim the honor of a continuous feast, but it did get an Octave Day. January 1 is the oldest Marian feast, the Octave of Christmas. It was originally a feast of the motherhood of Mary, although for centuries until 1969 it was called the Feast of the Circumcision. These familiar words from one of our best loved prayers give us the title for today's Solemnity as we launch the New Year. To celebrate Mary as mother of our God is to realize how close we humans have become to God, and what a powerful connection we still have today.

On this fortuitous day, when the first day of the calendar is also the first day of the week, we have the familiar practice of making resolutions, looking to the year ahead and anticipating what we want to incorporate into our lives.

What a perfect opportunity to involve our mother more in our lives. With the 2,000 year journey she's had with us, we've gotten to know well what opens the doors to experiencing her help and her presence.

In particular, the message she shared with us one hundred years ago from this anniversary year, 2017, gives us tools for transformation. Her words, which spanned visits over six months, can be summarized in three primary endeavors: prayer, penance, and devotion to her Immaculate Heart.

Calling to the children of Fatima, she reemphasized the importance of the rosary, an accessible resource that we can make our own. Penance refers to our own conversion and what we undertake for others to experience God's love, especially as the prayer from Fatima says, 'those most in need of thy mercy'. Finally, devotion to Mary's Immaculate Heart is a particularly beautiful invitation for us to consecrate ourselves and our families to her.

Having concluded the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy in 2016, this New Year gives us a beautiful opportunity to deepen the emerging trust we have in our God and the help he sends from heaven.
