THE CHOSEN REMNANT

Zephaniah is one of the least-known of the Old Testament prophets. He speaks in today's first reading of impending judgment. But the Lord will leave a "remnant" in Israel. This image of a remnant, or remainder, was to become vital to both Judaism and Christianity.

Paul's letter to Corinth makes obvious his deep concern for the Christians there. They are too self-confident, he says, too sure of themselves. He admonishes them to remember that Christ has given them all they have.

Today's Gospel comprises the opening of Jesus' "Great Sermon." As God gave Moses the law on Sinai, so now Jesus gathers his disciples on a hillside to teach them the new law. Each of these Beatitudes contrasts the humiliation of the present with the glory of the future: poverty vs. the riches of God's kingdom, hunger for holiness vs. fulfillment in the Spirit, persecution vs. the reign of God. Jesus is here speaking to God's chosen "remnant."

One of the authors recently to come speak at our parish, Vinny Flynn, has a series of titles drawing on the same theme: the Seven Secrets--the Seven Secrets of the Eucharist, the Seven Secrets of Confession, the Seven Secrets of Divine Mercy . . .

While the titles are somewhat tongue in cheek, since the insights into these treasures are of course not concealed but just little known, the term does express well the dynamic of so many mysteries of our Faith. As Catholics, we have so many liberating and life-changing insights that can truly transform a person's experience, but so often they are overlooked in our day and age.

This of course is compounded by the reality that our greatest concepts are often counter-cultural: what we promote as freeing is precisely what our society fears as diminishment. For instance, Jesus' description of the freedom that comes from simplicity, not running after, defining oneself, by possessions, cuts directly across our culture's consumerism, which believes happiness comes from having more.

Our Scriptures today give us one of the most profound and fundamental concepts of our Catholic practice. 'Seek humility,' says our first reading; 'Seek the Lord, you humble of the earth.' Zephaniah identifies as life-giving the deliberate embrace of lowliness: 'But I will leave as a remnant in your midst a people humble and lowly.' Many have characterized our age as being more egocentric, narcissistic than ever: this guideline from the Word of God attacks the very core of how we see ourselves.

Humility however is one of the most basic secrets to happiness. The person who does not have to invest a substantial amount of energy keeping up a false front, an inflated profile of themselves, but who has become authentically grounded, that person is able to truly live in the present rather than constantly be reinterpreting every moment through the filter of self-preservation.

As Jesus in our Gospel today confirms that it is the poor in spirit, the meek who thrive in God's blessing, we can rediscover a secret of our Faith, jettisoning our cultural assumptions and learning to live in the authentic freedom of the children of our Heavenly Father.

Irónicamente, estos tesoros son por supuesto no ocultos pero apenas poco conocidos, el término expresa perfectamente la dinámica de los muchos misterios de nuestra fe. Como católicos, tenemos percepciones que pueden librarnos y que pueden transformar verdaderamente a una persona, pero con tanta frecuencia pasan por alto en nuestros días.

Esto, por supuesto, se agrava por la realidad de que nuestros conceptos más importantes son a menudo contra-culturales: lo que promovemos como liberación es precisamente lo que nuestra sociedad teme como disminución. Por ejemplo, la descripción de Jesús que la libertad viene de la simplicidad, nuestras posesiones no nos definen, habla directamente el consumismo de nuestra cultura, que cree que la felicidad viene de tener más.

Nuestras Escrituras nos dan hoy uno de los conceptos más profundos y fundamentales de nuestra práctica católica. «Busca la humildad», dice nuestra primera lectura; 'Busquen al Señor, ustedes humildes de la tierra'. Sofonías identifica como vivificante el abrazo deliberado de la humildad: "Yo dejare en medio de ti, pueblo mío, un punado de gente pobre y humilde". Muchos han caracterizado nuestra época como egocéntrica y narcisista. Esta guía de la Palabra de Dios ataca el núcleo mismo de cómo nos vemos a nosotros mismos.

La humildad sin embargo es uno de los secretos más básicos a la felicidad. La persona que no tiene que invertir una cantidad sustancial de energía aparentando lo que no tiene, un perfil exagerado de sí mismos, pero que ha llegado a ser auténticamente fundamentado, esa persona es capaz de vivir verdaderamente en el presente en vez de reinterpretar constantemente cada momento El filtro de la auto conservación.

Como Jesús en nuestro Evangelio hoy confirma que son los pobres en espíritu, los mansos que prosperan en la bendición de Dios, podemos redescubrir un secreto de nuestra fe, desechando nuestras suposiciones culturales y aprendiendo a vivir en la auténtica libertad de los hijos de nuestro Divino Padre.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Until very recent decades “Holy Thursday” and “Good Friday” were centered on personal pious devotions, not public liturgy. In urban America, at least in cities with a significant Catholic population, Holy Thursday was about veneration of the Blessed Sacrament. People were encouraged to walk to seven churches for a “visit” to each parish’s repository, a kind of temporary tabernacle on a side altar, closer in proximity to the faithful than the usual tabernacle on the distant high altar. On Good Friday, the most popular form of devotion was the Stations of the Cross, or a three-hour program of word and preaching beginning at noon.

The Holy Thursday seven-church hike was a way of participating in a custom of the city of Rome. Traditionally, each day in Lent was assigned to a particular parish church or basilica in the city. Each week of Lent thus had seven churches, and pious people tried to get to each one of them. The pilgrimage was a symbol of unity and also the journey of faith. Originally, the pope would go to each place for a liturgy, but political strife removed the pope from Rome in 1305. With the papacy relocated in France, the custom ceased until Pope Leo XIII expressed interest in restoring it in 1900, and Blessed John XXIII fully restored the custom in 1959. By the time Pope Leo began to revive the custom, many American cities had enough parishes and monasteries that the faithful could vicariously participate in the revived tradition of stational liturgies by a very long walk!

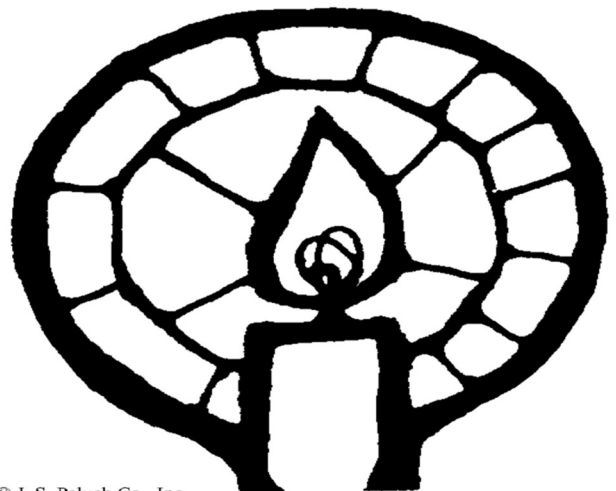
