Pastor's Corner

Jesus began a project he didn't mean to finish alone. As soon as he started working, he began recruiting followers, and in today's Gospel passage he gives twelve their first assignment.

We're reading from Mark 6 this Sunday, and Jesus gives the Apostles three primary abilities. The first is authority over evil spirits, a gift we often forget about after 2,000 years. Second, a call to repentance: Jesus launched his ministry proclaiming a kingdom that allows us to be free, and the twelve also call others away from sin.

Finally, the Apostles anoint the sick with oil to cure them. Healing is the heart of Jesus' ministry, and he needs his followers to be bringing his blessing to others. In our church today we still practice anointing, asking for the Holy Spirit to be poured out for strength and restoration. We anoint with oil because the twelve did, and God still brings healing today.

Jesus hasn't finished his work. There are still people who need freedom from evil spirits, people who need to discover the freedom of repentance, people who need healing. Are you willing to help? Jesus has work for you to do, and many people who need you to help them. You can't give what you don't have, but if you draw near to the healer, he can send you out on an assignment of transformation.

Finalmente, los Apóstoles ungen a los enfermos con aceite para curarlos. La curación es el corazón del ministerio de Jesús, y él necesita que sus seguidores lleven su bendición a los demás. En nuestra iglesia hoy todavía practicamos la unción, pidiendo que el Espíritu Santo sea derramado para fortaleza y restauración. Ungimos con aceite porque los doce lo hicieron, y Dios todavía trae sanidad hoy.







EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS What We Carry from Town to Town

In my experience, there are two kinds of people: the folks who kick off their shoes the second they walk through the door, and the ones who don't. People can feel strongly about this on both sides. The main thrust of the Shoes-Off Brigade seems to be this: we track a lot of weird stuff on the soles of our feet. Little reminders of all the places we've been — whether it's a private home or a public bathroom — cling to our shoes long after we leave.

This same theory applies to our spiritual lives. As human beings and as disciples, we visit a lot of figurative towns and pick up a lot of figurative dust. Sinfulness. Shame. Defeat. Anger. Fear. Doubt. No matter how hard we try to keep free of it, these things have a way of attaching themselves to us, sometimes without us even noticing. We need to take a good look at what unhelpful and unconstructive baggage from our past we're tracking into our present and future encounters.

What is the "town" God is asking you to visit today in His name? Is it a tough conversation with a friend, a brief witness to a stranger in the checkout line, a call to be present to someone in your family? Before you go, remember, shake off the dust. Don't let a past disappointment constrain you. Don't allow yesterday's failures or burdens to keep you from the joy of today's witness, whatever form it might take.


What kind of religious practices should we begin, once we marry, to help us practice our faith each day?


Answer:

Your spiritual life as a couple is important. The sacrament of Marriage is a gift and a grace, but living it well isn't always easy! It requires intentionality and perseverance. Growing your spiritual life as a couple also requires a plan. Life can be incredibly busy. There's never "enough time" for everything we want to do. But we can live by our priorities. If we don't

prioritize prayer, we'll find it slowly disappear from our lives.

If you're not already praying individually, that's a good place to start. If your schedules are similar, take some quiet time at the same time to help hold each other accountable. Praying together is also important! You could start by looking at the religious practices of your family and of families around you that you respect. Talk with your spouse about the ones who make the deepest impression on you or were most meaningful when you were young. Think about what you want your future children to experience. Making faith a commitment now will mean it is engrained habit when you grow your family. Ultimately, these faith practices should help us grow in our love for God and for one another.





A POSSESSION ON A JOURNEY July 2, 2021 • Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman For Sunday, July 11, 2021 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time You Belong to God

Amos 7:12-15 Ephesians 1:3-14 or 1:3-10 Mark 6:7-13

"He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick—no food, no sack, no money in their belts."

I am the mother of young children, so that means I am a packer. I am a maker of lists and a checker of inventory. I may not be organized, but I am prepared. Take a dive into my messy purse and my even messier minivan, and you will find the stores of a Doomsday prepper. I have bandages, I have water bottles, I have snacks, I have sunscreen, I have hairbands, I have pepper spray — I even have one of those things that breaks the window of a car and slices the seatbelts in case you drive off a bridge and your vehicle becomes submerged in water. I. Am. Ready.

That's why this week's Gospel sometimes makes me want to tear my hair out. Take nothing for the journey but a walking stick? Are you insane? No food? No pepper spray? No second tunic? What if we're beset by

marauders? What is a walking stick going to do? The whole idea horrifies me.

It horrifies me because I spend far too much of my life thinking that I actually have the ability to be prepared — that all my lists and packing give me control. Ah, control — it can be a beautiful thing, sometimes. It's important to have control when you are shepherding small children to and from activities. It's important to have control when there is a global pandemic and you are the designated family mask-keeper, and as you are pulling out of the driveway for church every weekend your husband, without fail, turns to you and says, "You've got my mask and the hand sanitizer, right?"

But control can also be a dangerous illusion, because, of course, as much as we try to tell ourselves otherwise, really don't have it — not when it comes to anything meaningful.

We have been sent on the journey with no food, no sack, and no money in our belts. We have been given sandals to guard our steps, and a walking stick upon which to lean when the road seems too long.

The second reading today beautifully describes us as "God's possession," which is such a lovely thought, especially for those of us who are almost pathologically self-reliant. A possession cannot care for itself; its entire existence relies on its possessor. Likewise, the first reading gives us the image of Amos, being ejected from the Temple at Bethel by Amaziah the priest. What does Amos do? In essence, he tells Amaziah that he is but God's possession, walking the path laid before him by God, equipped only with what God has given him for the work. And he shakes the dust from his feet.

I can control the number of band-aids I have in my purse; I cannot control whether or not my children are injured. I can control the masks we wear in public; I cannot control COVID-19. I can control my behavior, my faithfulness to God's laws, and my public witness to the Gospel message; I cannot control whether or not those things bring anyone closer to Christ, or simply lead them to reject me.

I can get caught up in this lack of control, and let it break my heart — or I can remember that I am but

God's possession, walking the path set out for me, with precisely the provisions I need.


PRAYER


