PASTOR'S CORNER

What's happening in our first reading from Isaiah 50? First, Isaiah describes being able to hear God clearly. He immediately follows that with a description of being beaten and attacked. Is he saying that listening to God wins us enemies and hatred?

You probably recognize at some level that responding to a voice from beyond this world dislodges you from voices within this world. Paying attention to God is dangerous, because you stop paying attention to the mandates swirling around your ankles.

Isaiah describes extraordinary power in a strength beyond this world: "The Lord God is my help, who will prove me wrong?" Get off the fence and commit fully to heaven, Isaiah teaches, and you discover that all the whispered threats in this world can't compete with the power of God.

Jesus confirms this divine power in the Gospel today. He reveals to his disciples that he is not just another human being here to share opinions, but instead is the anointed one from heaven. Jesus outstrips what this world has to offer: entering into his life means leaving this life behind. Like a rocket leaving orbit and the power of earth's gravity, the person who commits to God's life leaves this life in the dust: "For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."

It's been many centuries since Isaiah wrote, but there this world still warns us not to pay attention to God. Try prayer today, and discover that God frees you from this world's harm.

¿Qué está sucediendo en nuestra primera lectura de Isaías 50? Primero, Isaías describe poder escuchar a Dios con claridad. Inmediatamente lo sigue con una descripción de haber sido golpeado y atacado. ¿Está diciendo que escuchar a Dios nos gana enemigos y odio?

Probablemente reconozcas en algún nivel que responder a una voz de más allá de este mundo te desaloja de las voces dentro de este mundo. Prestar atención a Dios es peligroso, porque dejas de prestar atención a los mandatos que giran alrededor de tus tobillos.

Isaías describe un poder extraordinario en una fuerza más allá de este mundo: "El Señor Dios es mi ayuda, ¿quién demostrará que estoy equivocado?" Sal del valla y comprométete plenamente con el cielo, enseña Isaías, y descubrirás que todas las amenazas susurradas en este mundo no pueden competir con el poder de Dios.

Jesús confirma este poder divino en el Evangelio de hoy. Les revela a sus discípulos que no es un ser humano más aquí para compartir opiniones, sino que es el ungido del cielo. Jesús supera lo que este mundo tiene que ofrecer: entrar en su vida significa dejarla atrás. Como un cohete que sale de la órbita y el poder de la gravedad de la tierra, la persona que se compromete con la vida de Dios deja esta vida en el polvo: "Porque el que quiera salvar su vida, la perderá, pero el que pierda su vida por mí y por el evangelio la salvará."

Han pasado muchos siglos desde que escribió Isaías, pero allí este mundo todavía nos advierte que no le prestemos atención a Dios. Pruebe la oración hoy y descubra que Dios lo libera del daño de este mundo.


STEWARDSHIP




UNDERSTANDING FAITHFUL DISCIPLESHIP

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Isaiah 50:5-9a James 2:14-18 Mark 8:27-35

Jesus began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days... He summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me.—Mark 8:31, 34

We've all experienced it: life was wonderful and everything seemed to be going along smoothly. Your career and relationships were moving forward with no conflicts or stress. Your family members were healthy. You knew you were loved and you were surrounded by your loved ones.

And then, *it* happened. A phone call reporting an accident or death. Your child or parent has gotten sick. A job has been lost ... Whatever *it* was, things changed for you and your family. There was no going back to before. I imagine that Peter and the Apostles experienced that same sinking feeling when they heard Jesus say that he would have to suffer and die. After all, things had been

going so well for Jesus and his friends as they traveled from town to town, teaching the crowds and healing the sick.

This Sunday's gospel falls at the half-way point of Mark's Gospel and signals a turning point as Jesus begins his journey to Jerusalem where he will eventually suffer betrayal, rejection, and torture, before dying on a cross.

Although we know that the story ends with the Easter morning Resurrection, in the passage we hear this Sunday, the Resurrection is a far-off event. Peter and the Apostles weren't prepared to hear that something horrible was looming on the horizon.

When Jesus asks Peter, "Who do you say that I am?"
Peter's reply is spot on: "You are the Christ." This is a great statement of Peter's faith, but it was also loaded with political and cultural implications. For Peter and many of Jesus' other followers, the Christos — the Messiah or "anointed one" — would be the long-awaited king who would bring justice and prosperity to the oppressed People of Israel. But Jesus makes it clear that he is not that kind of messiah and his followers won't enjoy royal privileges. Jesus explains that, if those traveling with him are to be true disciples, they will have to imitate his example, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me."

By telling us to "take up" our cross, Jesus isn't saying that we have to meekly submit to unfair treatment and suffering or embrace a blind, "offer it up" sort of spirituality. And, while they may be opportunities for grace, illness, sad events or even disasters aren't "the cross." There is nothing particularly Christian about many of the challenges we face in daily life. Finally, we can never silently or blindly accept abuse or injustice as being the will of God. Jesus rejected these and so should we. Instead, "the cross" that we are to carry is the sacrifices, trials, and hardships that can be a consequence of placing our faith and hope in him and of living according to his teaching.

The consequences — or "cost" — of discipleship (to borrow the phrase from <u>Dietrich Bonhoeffer</u>) can take two forms. The first is that by saying "yes" to Jesus, we willingly set aside ways of thinking and acting that are at odds with the Christian life. Faithful discipleship demands that we sacrifice for the good of others, promote peace and justice, and seek God's will in whatever comes our way. It means being a person of love and hope. The second consequence is much more dramatic and costly, physical suffering and even death for the sake of Jesus and the Gospel.

As we know, countless Christians around the world have suffered — and continue to suffer — simply because of their faith in Jesus. We can think of so many examples from the past months and years of Christians who have suffered exile, whose communities have been ravaged, and of those who have given their lives for their faith. Pope Francis reflected on this reality when he remarked, "May the Lord, today, make us feel within the body of the Church, the love for our martyrs and also our vocation to martyrdom. We do not know what will happen here: we do not know."

As we embrace the cross and accept the consequences of following Jesus the Christ, we can find comfort and strength in the knowledge that the cross was not the end for Jesus and it is not the end of our story either. Jesus conquered death. The Resurrection transforms the cross — his and ours — into a sign of hope and life, "Whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."


