PASTOR'S CORNER

This is our first Sunday after the Christmas Season ended last week with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. But even though it's our first Sunday, in the missal it's listed as the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time. What's going on?

With last Sunday concluding the Christmas Season, Monday and all the days following were the first week of the newly begun season. That means we're now entering the second week of Ordinary Time. So today is the Sunday of the Second Week of Ordinary Time.

If there's anything certain to be confusing, it's calendars. For some reason God didn't create the earth's orbit of the sun on a decimal system. If a week has seven days, each month has a variable amount. If a year has 365 days (divisible neither by 7 nor 12) it needs to be corrected every few years to keep it on track with our orbit.

Perhaps a reminder that there's more to life than first meets the eye.

But returning to our first Sunday which is the Second Sunday, what is our kickoff message? What theme do we find in the prayers and readings of this day?

Our opening prayer shares a petition I think we can all agree with: "Almighty ever-living God, who govern all things, both in heaven and on earth, mercifully hear the pleading of your people and bestow your peace on our times." Recognizing God as ruler of both heaven and earth is important in these tumultuous times, and 2021 has dawned as needing peace even more than 2020.

Turning to our Scripture passages, we have a beautiful moment at the launch of this new season. At the beginning of John's Gospel (today we're at John 1:35-42) we have the disciples meeting Jesus for the first time. Notice how it happens: Andrew first meets Jesus, and then goes and finds his brother and brings him to Jesus. So simple, but so powerful. Our first pope, the rock on which a 2,000 year community has been founded, is brought to Jesus through a conversation with his brother.

You may not know which day it is, you may be concerned about the state of the world, but God's call for you is simple. Come meet Jesus, spend time with him, and share him with your brother.

Rincón Del Pastor

Este es nuestro primer Domingo después de que la temporada navideña terminó la semana pasada con la celebración del Bautismo del Señor. Pero a pesar de que es nuestro primer Domingo, en el misal aparece como el Segundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. ¿Qué está pasando?

Con el último Domingo concluyendo la temporada navideña, el Lunes y todos los días siguientes fueron la primera semana de la temporada recién iniciada. Eso significa que ahora estamos entrando en la segunda semana del tiempo ordinario. Así que hoy es el Domingo de la segunda semana del tiempo ordinario.

Si hay algo que puede resultar confuso, son los calendarios. Por alguna razón, Dios no creó la órbita terrestre del sol en un sistema decimal. Si una semana tiene siete días, cada mes tiene una cantidad variable. Si un año tiene 365 días (divisible ni por 7 ni por 12), es necesario corregirlo cada sietos años para mantenerlo alineado con nuestra órbita.

Quizás un recordatorio de que hay más en la vida de lo que parece a primera vista.

Pero volviendo a nuestro primer Domingo, que es el segundo Domingo, ¿cuál es nuestro mensaje de inicio? ¿Qué tema encontramos en las oraciones y lecturas de este día?

Nuestra oración de apertura comparte una petición con la que creo que todos podemos estar de acuerdo: "Dios Todopoderoso y eterno, que gobiernas todas las cosas, tanto en el cielo como en la tierra, escucha misericordiosamente las súplicas de tu pueblo y concede tu paz en nuestro tiempo". Reconocer a Dios como gobernante tanto del cielo como de la tierra es importante en estos tiempos tumultuosos, y el 2021 ha comenzado a necesitar paz incluso más que el 2020.

Volviendo a nuestros pasajes de las Escrituras, tenemos un momento hermoso en el lanzamiento de esta nueva temporada. Al comienzo del Evangelio de Juan (hoy estamos en Juan 1: 35-42) tenemos a los discípulos conociendo a Jesús por primera vez. Observe cómo sucede: Andrés primero se encuentra con Jesús, y luego va y encuentra a su hermano y lo lleva a Jesús. Tan simple, pero tan poderoso. Nuestro primer Papa, la roca sobre la que se ha fundado una comunidad de 2000 años, es llevado a Jesús a través de una conversación con su hermano.

Puede que no sepa qué día es, puede que le preocupe el estado del mundo, pero el llamado de Dios para usted es simple. Ven a conocer a Jesús, pasa tiempo con él y compártelo con tu hermano.

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, let us recall our own Baptism. We have all received the call to go and baptize all nations. Likewise, St. Isidore parish community is also responsible for welcoming and sharing the Faith with all those preparing for reception into the Catholic. Yes, Body of Christ shares in being a part of bringing people into the Church – not just the RCIA ministry. Becoming a Catholic is a community experience. By living your faith, praying for conversion, and welcoming new people to St. Isidore's, we all share in the RCIA process. The community models Christian living and receives the new brother or sister into parish life. RCIA is looking for sponsors to accompany candidates on their spiritual journey. If you love God, and live Catholic way of life, we invite you to discern if God is calling you to "go and make disciples." You do not have to have all the answers, just a heart for Jesus. 





For Sunday, January 17, 2021 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time



1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19
1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20
John 1:35-42

“What are you looking for?” Jesus asked, which he follows with an invitation to “come and see,” in response to the disciples’ question about where he is staying. Of course, Jesus knew what they were seeking; is it not what we all seek — peace, hope, salvation? Jesus calls them, and indeed us as well, to accept his invitation to find those things, and so much more, in him.

Regardless of where Jesus resides physically, we know from his teaching later in John’s Gospel, what he longs to show us is where he abides. In [John 15:4-16](#), Jesus shares the blessing of abiding with him; there, we can bear much fruit in our faith, receive what we, and most importantly, know the Father’s glory.

Jesus’ invitations present an opportunity for us to contemplate what we are looking for and to take stock of our current situation. Do you know what it is you seek in this world? Are you open to truly be a disciple of Jesus Christ? Can you leave behind your expectations, trusting the goodness of Jesus’ invitation, and follow God’s perfect will for your life?

Without waiting for the early disciples to respond, knowing their hearts and that the Kingdom of Heaven holds everything they seek, he invites them to come and see. Some of Jesus’ disciples came and stayed with him because they had heard him preach. Moved by the promise, hope, mercy, and life he offered, they directly accepted the invitation from him. However, like Peter, others came to follow Jesus after someone else extended an invitation to “come and see” themselves.

Peter’s brother Andrew’s willingness to evangelize brought Peter to become a disciple of the Lord. Andrew’s love for Peter moved him to share the truth and joy he had found. How blessed to have someone care enough to step out in faith and share the life found only in Jesus — no matter how uncomfortable they may feel or how their testimony may be received.

Those who believe inspire others to believe. John’s Gospel also introduces us to the Samaritan woman Jesus meets at the well. Her encounter with Christ spurs a conversion so dramatic, she cannot keep it to herself. Transformed by his love, mercy, and hope of a life where she no longer has to thirst for acceptance and redemption, she leaves her past behind and becomes an unlikely evangelist. Moved by her transformation from accepting Jesus’ invitation to come and see — she goes out immediately to share the Good News — causing a ripple effect of discipleship.

The lives of the people she encounters and invites, are never the same once they accept the invitation to follow and abide in the truth and love offered by Jesus. One of the most powerful moments in John’s Gospel ([4:41-42](#)) occurs when we learn many more have come to believe. And those she has testified to come back saying, “It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves and know that this One truly is the Savior of the world.”

The power and beauty of evangelization manifests in the conversion of hearts when an invitation leads to a personal encounter with Christ and the choice to remain and abide with him. We may recognize our journey within these many roads to discipleship; which of these paths is yours? Will we pay forward what we have received? Do we have the courage and strength to follow Jesus’ example and invite others to come and see? When we, like Andrew and the woman at the well, tell others about finding the Messiah, we become part of the hope of discipleship present in John’s Gospel. We become conduits for others to encounter the truth and grace found only in Jesus Christ.
